Contest Guidelines:

Please include a cover page with your first and last name, email address, phone number, name of school, and grade level. All essays must be typed with a minimum of 500 words, maximum of 2000 words. Students are permitted to submit their essays in English. Essays will be judged on content, clarity, and grammar. *Winners* will be announced the week of March 2, 2020. Student winners must arrange their own transportation to and from Touro Law Center for the conference. Anyone under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian 21 or over.
